The distinction is made for reasons which I will now explain.

The allegations described first above were repeated almost times without number by Mr. Hepburn and a very limited number of his friends, during the campaign preceding the last Provincial election. At the time I made appeal to the then Prime Minister of Canada to institute a Judicial investigation into the charges so made. This appeal was ultimately acceded to, and the Chief Justice of Canada was appointed Commissioner to conduct such judicial investigation. Prior, however, to his actually commencing the work, another Judicial enquiry was launched by Mr. Hepburn's Government, to be carried on by Chief Justice Latchford of Ontario and by Mr. Justice Smith (retired). At this point, though, I do add with all sincersty that the conduct of the enquiry was most unfair to me and others concerned. There has been no Judicial enquiry into the second series of allegations referred to above. You will, however, observe from the newspaper reports enclosed herewith that the Frime Minister has promed introduction of legislation into the Ontario House provide for an enquiry being conducted by Mr. John M. Godfrey, Securities Commissioner of the Province of Ontario. I have no desire to make any reflection whatever on Mr. Godfrey. It is, however, important to keep in mind that he is appointed by and paid by the Government of which Mr. Hepburn is the head, and holds his office at the pleasure of that Government.
