Sir,-

It is intended to purchase with the proceeds of the sale of the Right of Way of the Canadian Northern Ryrs, 240 acres of land adjoining the Fairford Indian reserve. I have to request that when you are at Fairford you will be good enough to consult the Indian Council and then to survey the tract they desire.

The said tract is to consist of a quarter section and the half of a quarter section. The adjacent Township has been recently surveyed; it will therefore be only necessary to survey (post and mound) the unsurrendered limits of the block and to retrace the surveyed limits.

Your report, and sketch of this survey should be sent to this Department as soon as it is made in order that no time be lost in securing the land for the Indians.
