Chief Inspector Clen Campbell has for some time been in correspondence with the Department towards arranging an exchange of land in the Pine River Indian Reserve No.66A on the west shore of Lake Winnipegoeis, with a view of having the outlying portions surrendered and exchanged for lands to the west of the main reserve 66A.

The Department of the Interior proposes to grant frae tional sections 1,2 and 3 and Sections 10,12, theN.E. & and S.& sec. 13 and all of Secs.14,15,16,17 and 18 in Tp.36,R.20, W.1.M. and the Frac. N.W. t. of Sec. 15, Frac. W. 2 Sec. 22, Frac. W. 2 Sec. 27, and the Frac. W. 2 Sec. 34, in Tp. 35, R. 20, W.1.M., in exchange for the surrender from the Indians of Pine River Indian Reserve No.668, South of Pine Creek settlement and the Islands and parts of Islands lying to the East of the main reserve and all the portions of the Indian reserve lying to the North and East of the production of the North boundaries The lands proposed to be surrendered are of Sections 22,23 and 24, shown coloured in green on the socompanying sheet.

The lands proposed to be granted are shown coloured in plain yellow. The lands coloured in yellow and hatched with red lines are these which the Indians have asked for previously but which cannot be granted.
