time, either Chief Dudoward or Wallace of Port Simpson will accompany your officers and show them the side as there are some Indian graves in close proximity which the Indians desire left outside of the land surrendered, but that this will in no way interfere with the light-house site. Upon this Department being furnished with a plan of survey of the lighthouse site, and a surrender thereof will be prepared and transmitted for execution in the usual way.
