I am, B-31159 A/Sgt. Currie, R.I., Messing Sergeant, Delville Officer's Mess, No. 1 Training Wing, No. 1 C.S.R.U. On the night of the 26-27 Aug 43, at approximately 0200 hrs I had gone to bed and awoke on hearing a rifle shot but I did not get up until I heard someone calling for help. I put on my tunic and went outside to investigate. At the Delville Officers gate Sentry box I found Gunner Weaver had been injured and immediately went to phone the F.A.P. I then came outside and found Lieut. Carson attending the wounded man. The Lieut. Carson and I assisted in taking off the wounded man's sock, ankle and boot from his left leg. There had been no response from the F.A.P. so I went inside and phoned again on instructions from Lieut. Carson. We then took Gunner Weaver in to the warmth of the kitchen in the Delville Officer's Mess. The ambulance came shortly after and took him away. During the affair Gnr. Weaver did not speak to me at all.
