A large and flourishing town on the south shore of the river St. Lawrence, opposite Quebec, Seigniory of Lauzon, parish of Notre-Dame de la Victoire, county of Levis. It is divided into three different wards, namely: the wards of St. Laurent, Notre-Dame and Lauzon. The head post office is in Lauzon ward, and branches of it in St. Laurent and Notre-Dame wards. An extensive trade of timber and fire wood is carried on here, which is surpassed in the Province only in the cities of Montreal, Ottawa and Quebec. Several manufactures are in operation. Montreal Telegraph Co. has two offices here, one at the railway depot, and another in Hadlow Cove. The station of the Grand Trunk railway is situated in the St. Laurent ward. Two steamboats ply every quarter of an hour between Levis and Quebec. Distant from Quebec one mile, fare, 3c.; from Richmond 96 miles, and from Montreal 174 miles. Mail daily. Population about 7000.
