MARKET REVIEW AND FORECAST

TORONTO, July 13.—Canada is going to be a bumper crop this year. Tending all lines into consideration we may expect a liberal crop...

Unusual firmness has been observed on all the Eastern markets during the past week. Consequently eggs for this year is said to be unprecedented...

Receipts of poultry have markedly increased during the past week and prices have eased off. There is little, if any, storage poultry left.

DAIRY PRODUCE.

Butter prices here are reported steady by about a half a cent a pound. Toronto dealers paying from 41 1/2c to 42c at current prices for creamery solids...

CHEESE BOARDS.

Receipts of cheese for the week ending July 6 at Montreal were 59,300 boxes, an increase of 2,227 cases as compared with the previous week and 2,174 boxes over the same week last year...

In the prairie provinces the situation is decidedly poor. The Hon. Mr. Motherwell, Minister of Agriculture for Saskatchewan, states that in some districts in that province the crops have been almost entirely ruined...

WHEAT. Precisely all of the mills are short of supplies for grinding. During the past week no wheat has arrived at the head office of the lake for distribution at Ontario mills...

COARSE GRAINS. Oats strengthened rapidly during the early part of the week but they have since the market overreached itself and strong advances were followed by smaller declines...

MILL FEEDS. Farmers apparently are buying mill feeds whenever they get the opportunity and the market is kept cleaned up. Hay is quoted 30c at Toronto and Montreal and shorts, 34c.

HAY AND STRAW. New hay has as yet arrived on the market. There is still much old hay in the country, but it will not be needed because of the shortage of the new crop.

POTATOES AND BEANS. The market for new potatoes is very firm. Ontario are quoted at 32.00 a bushel and Carleton Place at 31 to 32 a bush. There are no old crop potatoes on the market.

HIDES AND WOOL. Beef hides, green, 15c; part cured, 14c; cured, 13c; deacons or bob calf, 11.50 to 12.50; horsehide, complete take-off, No. 1, 15 to 18; No. 2, 14 to 15; No. 1 sheepskin, 12.50 to 13.50; horsehair, farmers' stock, 20c per lb.
