A Message by Mr. *William Boutillier*, Gentleman Usher of the Black Rod:

Mr. Speaker,

The Honourable PRESIDENT and Administrator of the Government of this Province, desires the immediate attendance of this Honorable House, in the Upper House of Legislature.
