most happy Constitution, a right to do; therefore the petitioner most humbly prays, that the said Benjamin Beaubien, Esquire, and the said Lieutenant Colonel F Dechambaud, may be ordered to be taken into the custody of the Serjeant at Arms, and brought to the Bar of the House, to receive such judgment, as in its wisdom, it shall think sit and adviseable.—The petitioner concludes with the humble prayer, that the House will take this his petition into consideration.

RESOLVED, that the grounds and reasons of complaint, stated in the said petition, (if true,) are sufficient to make void the election of Stephen Sewell, Esquire.

RESOLVED, that this House will, on Friday the second day of March next, take into consideration the grounds and reasons set forth in the petition of Austin Cuvillier, of Montreal, merchant, against the election of Stephen Sewell, Esquire, returned one of the Knights Representatives for the County of Huntingdon.

A Petition of James Strother and Robert Gilmore, whose names are thereunto subscribed, Executors of the last Will and Testament of the late John Conrad Marsteller, of Montreal, when living, was presented to the House by Mr. M'Cord, and the same was received and read;-SETTING FORTH: - That the Petitioners were appointed Executors of the last Will and Testament of the late John Conrad Marsteller, who on the 17th day of May, 1808, died, without heirs in this Province, leaving the following real and personal property, viz.—Two Lots of Land fituate in the St. Mary Suburbs of Montreal, with the Houses and other Buildings erected thereon, and Goods and other personal estate, to the amount of five hundred pounds—all his debts paid.—That the faid John Conrad Marsteller, by his Will, devised and bequeathed the said real estate, and all the residue of his estate, (his debts and certain small legacies being first paid) to the establishment of an House of Industry, upon the plan of Count Rumford, as carried into execution at Munich, in Bavaria: - And did leave to the petitioners, the possession and occupation of the faid two lots and houses, for two years, on condition that they should endeavor to obtain the said House to be established by an Act
