**EXEMPTIONS BETWEEN AGES OF TWENTY AND TWENTY-TWO INCLUSIVE ON ONE GROUND ONLY.**

OTTAWA, May 4—The following official announcement is made by the department of militia:

"It should be clearly understood that every man who is ordered by registers to report, must do so on date specified whether he proposes to claim leave of absence or not. Should he be between the ages of twenty and twenty-two, both inclusive, leave of absence will be granted on one ground only, namely, that he is the sole remaining son of military age in a family, the others being already serving, or having suffered death or disablement. Service in this case means service in some field of operations or in a unit in England or Canada providing drafts for service in field of operations. Men desiring to claim leave of absence on the above grounds should so state upon reporting to the depot battalion. They should have prepared a careful statement showing other sons of
