



GOLD MINING .- Application was made to the Local Legislature on Monday to incorporate the Antigonish Gold Mining Company. The applicants for the charter. are J. C. McDonald, Charles N. Wilkie, C. E. Harris and J. D. Copeland, who have been operating their mine since last summer with highly encouraging results. The mine is situated at Country Harbour, Guysboro County, and has the largest goldbearing belt in the Province - 14 feet.wide at one end and 9 at the other. The yield for February was 182 ounces (\$3500), and since the new year about \$8,000. If the mine continues to pan out any length of time as it is now doing, it will develop into one of the richest properties of its kind in the Province. A 10-stamp mill is used, and some thirty men are employed.
