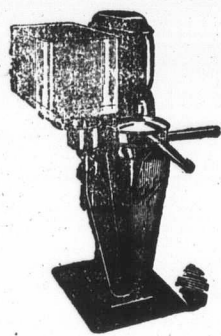

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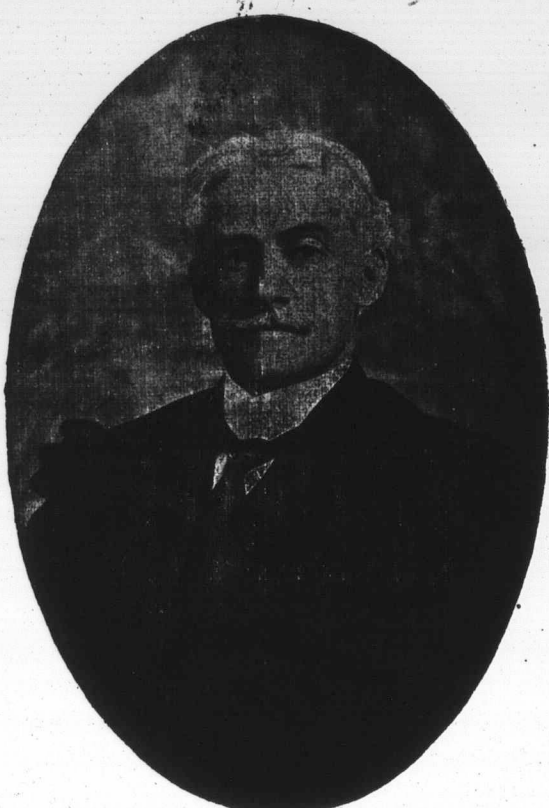

The Opening of the Legislature

Mr. A. E. Donovan, M. P. P., Brockville, Seconds the Address in Reply to the Speech From the Throne



The opening of the Ontario Legislature on Wednesday last was attended with all the formalities and flummery that usually characterizes this event. A blinding snowstorm driven by an easterly gale made life out of doors anything but pleasant, but within was an atmosphere of warmth and color. It was a brilliant social function, and the galleries were filled principally with ladies, each dressed in a way to support her idea that she was the equal if not the superior of every other lady in the building.

Following the formal opening came the speech from the throne, read by the lieutenant-governor, and the reply thereto. The duty of seconding this reply had been entrusted to Brockville's member, Mr. A. E. Donovan, and judging from the press comments, the duty was very creditably discharged. From reports and comments appearing in Toronto dailies we make the following extracts:—

Mail and Empire: In moving and seconding the address in reply to the speech from the throne, and thus opening the debate on the speech, Mr. C. R. McKeown, M. P. P. (Dufferin) and Mr. A. E. Donovan, M. P. P. (Brockville), made their initial bows as members of the Provincial Legislature. Both made stirring speeches, which showed that their oratorical abilities will be well applied during the session now in full swing. Mr. McKeown dwelt principally on the fact that there would be a substantial surplus, of probably \$500,000; on the subject of immigration from the Old Country, and rural school grants, while Mr. Donovan referred to the statements made prior to the last election, that the Conservative party had no material from which to choose a Cabinet. He dwelt on the fact that the work done in the department could not be surpassed, and that the people would certainly not oppose the Government when it again appealed to them. Mr. Donovan (Brockville) was greeted with rousing applause upon rising to make his maiden speech by seconding the address. He first referred to the Conservative victory in his own constituency, and said he had not the slightest doubt of the result when the bye-election was held. He knew that the people of Ontario were convinced that the Whitney Government was an honest Government and would be sustained when it made an appeal to the people during the course of a year or so. The people also knew that the Whitney Government was a business Government. As far as possible the Government had carried out its promises.

The Globe: Mr. McKeown is member for Dufferin, while Mr. Donovan has the distinction of representing the constituency which last session had the then leader of the Opposition, Hon. Geo. P. Graham, for its sponsor. Both gentlemen have reputations as practised speakers. Mr. Donovan perhaps enjoying the greater fame in this respect. The judgment of the House was probably that they had justified the fame that had preceded them. Mr. Donovan departed from the habitual manner of maiden speakers by being quite aggressive and critical. He praised the Government in mass and then in detail and the efforts of the serried wisdom of the Government benches to look detached and unconscious was a study in expression. Each

Minister seemed to be saying, as Mr. Donovan's praises unfolded themselves, "Well, it's all true, but please spare our blushes." Mr. Donovan's calm judgment was that the Whitney Administration was the greatest ever.

The Toronto Star heads its report of the opening thus: "Ladies Acclaim Donovan Adonis—Member From Brockville Makes a Hit at Opening of Legislature." A paragraph in its report says: "The ladies be it said, declared that Mr. Donovan was 'just too lovely,' besides being named Albert Edward after the King."

Toronto Telegram: One continued round of applause served to reward Mr. McKeown and welcome Mr. Donovan. The speech of the Brockville member showed that the Government had gained not one but two able debaters as a result of the bye-elections. Of the two addresses probably that of the Brockville man was the more effective. While not so dazzling as the Dufferin orator, he speaks with easy grace and fluency, and people would remember more of what he said. His language is good and his reasoning clear. Both speakers were brief.

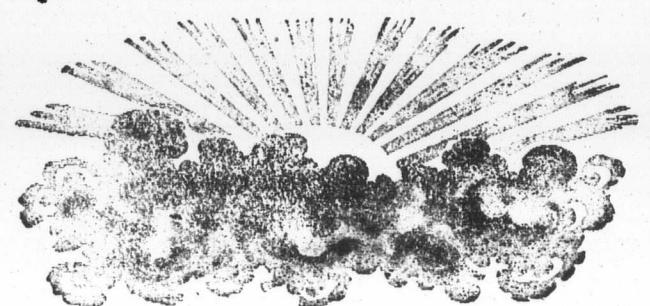
