NEW ROAD MAP OF NOVA SCOTIA Natural Resources Intelligence S vice Issues Useful Touring Ac

One of the pressing problems of those interested in attracting tourists to Nova Scotia has been the lack of a satisfactory road map. To meet the demand of the control of the province and the control of the province, recreational and otherwise, the Natural Resources Intelligence Service of the Department of the Interior, working in co-operation with provincial and other services, has issued a map of this province on a convenient scale. This map shows the principal natural resources, the motor roads, fishing and hunting resorts and steamaship routes to Nova Scotia from adjoining provinces and other countries. The different classes of roads in the province are clearly indicated, making it particularly useful as a motor highway map. In addition to the above data a vast amount of detailed topography and other information makes the map a valuable one for general purposes. Many Nova Scotians, do not appreciate the extent of motor tourist traffic to the province. This, in 1923, was represented by nearly 3,500 cars, and the present season bids fair to show a considerable influx of those tourists who are seeking a summer holiday in a pleasant environment.

Copies of the new map may be obtained on application to the Director, Natural Resources Intelligence Service, Department of the Interior, Ottawa, Ontario.
