

SYNOPSIS OF COAL MINING

REGULATIONS Coal mining right of the Dominion in Manitoba, Saskatchewan and Al berta, the Yukon Territory, the North-west Territories and in a portion of the Province of British Columbia may be leased for a term of twenty-one years at an annual rental of \$1 an acre. Not more than 2.500 acres will be leased to one applicant. Applications for a lease must pe made by the applicant in person to trict in which the rights applied for

the Agent or Sub-agent in the disare situated. In surveyed territory the land must be described by sections, or legal sub-divisions of sections, and in un surveyed territory the tract applied for shall be staked out by the appli cant himself.

Each application must be accom-

panied by a fee of \$5 which will be refunded if the rights applied for are not available, but not otherwise. royalty shall be paid on the merchantable output of the mine at the rate of five cents per ton. The person operating the mine shall furnish the agent with sworn returns accounting for the full quantity of merchantable coal mined and pay the coyalty thereon. If the coal mining

rights are not being operated, such returns should be furnished at leas once a year. The lease will include the coal mining rights only, but the lessee may available surface rights may be considered necessary for the working o
