### Two Unlucky Presidents.

General Daza, of Bolivia, Deposed and Following Prado in Flight.

PARIS, January 6.—An official dispatch received from Bolivia, dated January 4, announces that General Daza, President of the Republic of Bolivia, has been deposed and has fled.

General Hilario Daza is a man of small stature, but muscular, alert, brown as a nut and with a long white mustache, looking like a soldier of the knapsack of his helmet, which has given his friends occasion to baptize him "the resurrected Achilles," while his enemies call him "the incarnated Satan."

The latter also was not fairly warranted the latter appellation. He was born in 1850, of poor parents of Spanish and Indian blood. He grew up without any education whatever, and entered, when seven years old, in the ranks of the Bolivian army. In 1860 he was made a sergeant, in 1861 a lieutenant, in 1864 a major, and in 1868 he led a "scientific" expedition to the eastern boundary of Bolivia, to investigate the course of the River Timocayo.

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
