Summary of Night Dispatches

Ottawa, Nov. 2.—According to General Tylee, Air Commander, back here on his return from the Trans-Canada flight, there is nothing to prevent a regular forty-hour air service between Halifax and Vancouver with airplanes marked out every forty miles and with wireless control of the planes.

Settle Mexican Claim. Washington, Nov. 2.—Great Britain has agreed to a settlement of the claim against Mexico growing out of the killing of Wm. S. Benton, in 1915. The Mexican government will pay ten thousand dollars compensation to Mrs. Benton and a pension of \$250 a day as long as unmarried.

U. S. Imports Canadian Wheat. Washington, Nov. 2.—Imports of Canadian wheat and flour during the first fifteen days of October were greater than in any corresponding period in the last seven years, the federal trade commission says in a report yesterday to President Wilson.

Customs Officers Raid Lier. Boston, Nov. 2.—Customs officers who raided the White Star liner Celtic here yesterday for contraband liquor were beaten off by the crew. With the aid of sailors from a revenue cutter the crew was overpowered and 400 bottles of cognac, with a large quantity of drugs, were found.

The Tariff Commission. Ottawa, Nov. 2.—Sir Henry Drayton and Senator Robertson left Ottawa last night for Charlottetown to open the eastern hearings of the tariff commission.

Outrages in Alabama. Montgomery, Ala., Nov. 2.—Eleven negroes were in jail here yesterday in connection with the burning of unlicensed persons.

Riots at Cuban Elections. Havana, Nov. 2.—The Cuban presidential elections were held yesterday with comparative quiet. Eight persons were killed Sunday night and some were wounded.

Fruit Company Dividend. Boston, Nov. 2.—Directors of the United Fruit Company at a special meeting yesterday recommended a stock dividend of 100 per cent.

Mackenzie King Has Job Ahead. Winnipeg, Nov. 2.—The Tribune here yesterday stated that Hon. W. L. Mackenzie-King, Liberal leader, will attempt co-ordination of all political forces in Manitoba which are opposed to the present government. This is an open convention at which Labor and Farmer supporters will be invited.

Wrangel Forces Defeated. Sebastopol, Nov. 2.—The Bolsheviks have broken Gen. Wrangel's centre and have apparently crushed his wings in a drive on Trimes. The Reds already claim capture of Trimes.

Gen. Booth After Workers. Toronto, Nov. 2.—Gen. Branswell Booth, chief of staff of the Salvation Army, in Toronto yesterday, said he was in this country to obtain workers for the eastern world.

Urge Workers Away from Polls. New York, Nov. 2.—Large placards urging the workers to "boycott this election" resulted in the arrest of three men found posting them. They claimed they were not communists and said they were paid \$20 a day for the job.

Observe Armistice Day. London, Nov. 2.—Premier Lloyd-George, in the House of Commons yesterday, said a two-minute silence will be observed on Armistice Day throughout the United Kingdom and the Empire. He also noted that a special legislation was pending to deal with the use or possession of dum-dum bullets in Ireland.

To Safeguard Tenants. New York, Nov. 2.—Recent laws to safeguard tenants' interests at the recent session of the New York Legislature were declared unconstitutional in a decision handed down yesterday by Supreme Court Justice Henry T. Hotchkiss.

Outrages in Ireland. Dublin, Nov. 2.—Reports of shooting and reprisals over the week-end continue to be received here from various parts of Ireland. A district inspector of police was shot and killed at Grand Sunday night. At Tullamore a police sergeant was mortally wounded and died. Two constables were shot dead at Killorglin Sunday night. A police patrol was attacked in Abbey Dorney, a constable killed and two others wounded. The City Hall and a shop were burned in Tralee Sunday.

The St. John Dry Dock. St. John, N. B., Nov. 2.—Mr. Dufreres of the Courtney Works announced last night that they expect to have excavating in connection with the dry dock here completed in three months and also the breakwater.

Engagement Announced. Montreal, Nov. 2.—Engagement was announced last night of Capt. the Earl of Minto, eldest son of the late Governor General of Canada, and Marion, eldest daughter of Mr. and Mrs. G. W. Cook, of this city.

Big Hotel for Newfoundland. Toronto, Nov. 2.—St. John's, Nfld., is to have a new 200-room hotel to cost one million dollars, to be operated by the United Hotels Company. The capital invested in it is to be local capital. Plans therefore were discussed here last night by High Sheriff of Newfoundland and several other Newfoundlanders with George O'Neill, general manager of the King Edward Hotel.

An Issue of Greek Elections. Athens, Nov. 2.—Premier Venizelos declared at a public meeting yesterday that he was willing that the return of King Constantine to the throne of Greece be made one of the issues for the Greek people to decide in the coming elections. His speech is construed as meaning that should the Greek people so decide, the dynasty of King Constantine would be eliminated from the right of succession. There was no hint at the formation of a republic in the Premier's address.
