LAFAYETTE IN AMERICA.

Our cousins across the line
have resolved not to forget the
memory of the selfish young
French nobleman who, in 1778,
came to the rescue of the re-
volted colonies, and contributed
not merely the prestige of his
name, or even his personal
courage, but alas his unimpeach-
able purity and integrity of
character to their cause. The
Americans do well not to ignore
the chivalrous young man—
he was only just of age—who,
so soon as his Government had
signed the treaty with Franklin
and his fellow-envoys, crossed
the Atlantic at his own cost, and
risked his fortunes in the cause
of revolution. Lafayette was
precisely the man to stand by
the side of Washington, for in
their moral natures they were
closely akin. The Frenchman's
inferiority was displayed in
after years, when his mettle was
sorely tried in the fire on a
grand scale; but in America
his valour was well approved
his motives were beyond reproach,
and his loyalty to the cause
he embraced with so much
enthusiasm never faltered.

The moral effects of his adhe-
sion to the American banner were
even of more importance than
the material or intellectual as-
sistance he brought to bear on
its side. No leader of men him-
self, as subsequent events pro-
ved, Lafayette, as subordinate to
the American chief, was in his
right place. Both of them were
generals of strong moral fibre
and in grace of manner and cor-
diality of temper the Frenchman
surpassed the American. But
he did not possess Washington's
prescience, his unwearied pa-
tience, his strategical skill. Yet
this young nobleman, without
experience of any sort, was
tower of strength to the revolu-
tionary cause. During that
period of discord, when the de-
signs of the great chief were in
danger of being thwarted by
jealousy and impatience, Lafay-
ette never for a moment wavered
in his ardent attachment to
Washington. He was offered
rival command by the malcon-
tents, but his honour proved
true as steel, and so remained
until the end.

He had plunged into the
struggle with the arduous
youth, but also with the firm
settled principles which were
his sheet-anchor during a long
career extending over nearly
eighty years. "It was his resolu-
tion," says Brougham, "never to
fellowship with crime, even if
the salvation of his own coun-
try—never to do, or to suffer, or
to be much as witness, evil if
good may come." To this
immovability of character, La-
fayette added a nature
rare sweetness and grace, and
all his noble qualities were
given to America when in
first flower of generous
The Yorktown Centenary

and their recognition by
