TAKEN BY ROOKE IN 1704 AS AN AFTERTHOUGHT.

On Aug. 4, 1704 (new style) the Rock of Gibraltar was captured by Great Britain, and it has remained in her possession from that day to this. Among the many possessions scattered all over the globe that are comprised in the British Empire today, there is none that the nation holds with greater tenacity, for reasons both of sentiment and of material interest, and none that it would lose with more poignant shame and sorrow than the redoubtable stronghold we took from Spain at the beginning of the reign

of Queen Anne.

The fact that throughout the eighteenth century, when so many conquests in both hemispheres changed hands backward and forward in successive wars and un-der successive treaties, Gibraltar remain-ed permanently in the keeping of Engder successive treaties, Gibraltar remained permanently in the keeping of England, might seem to prove that British sentiment with regard to it was from the first the same as it is today?
