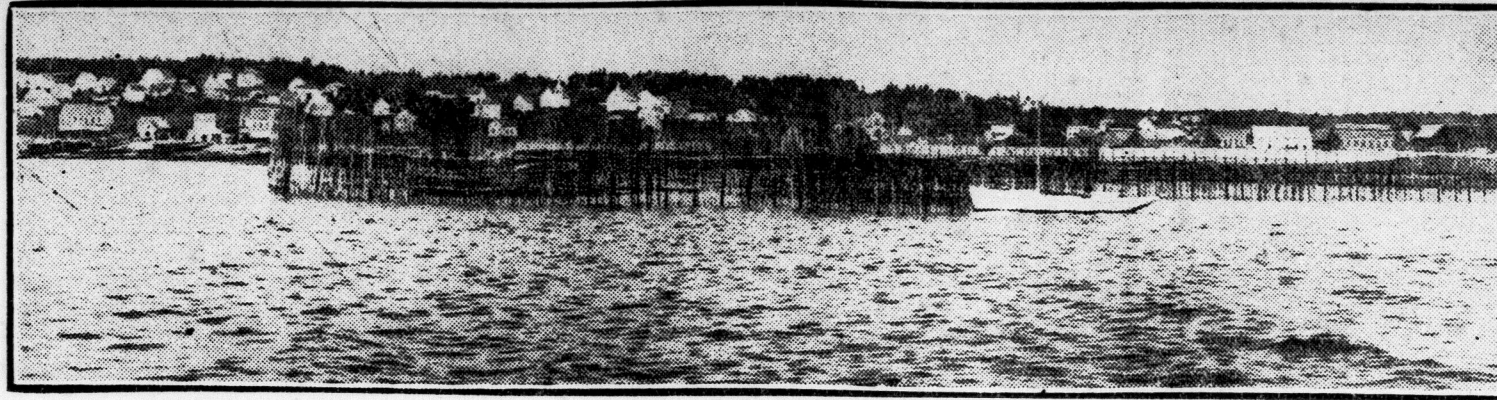
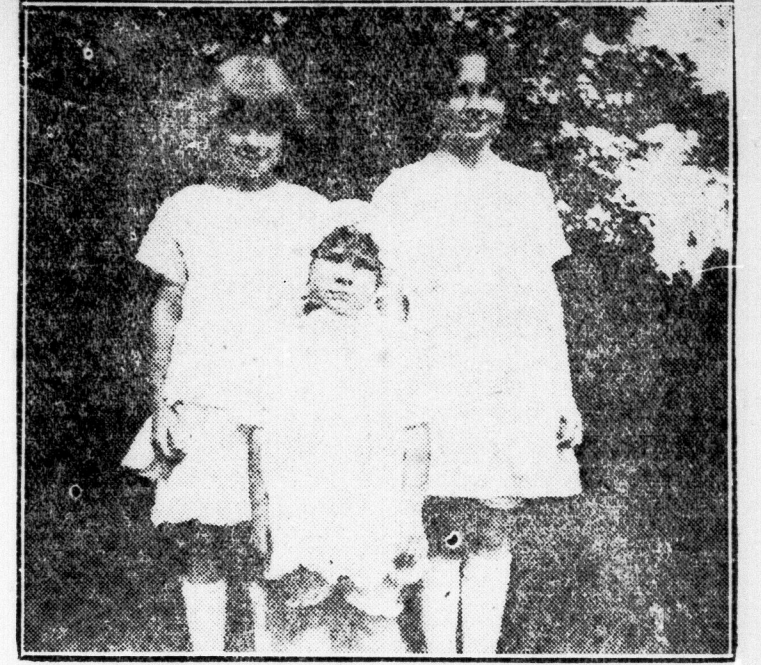




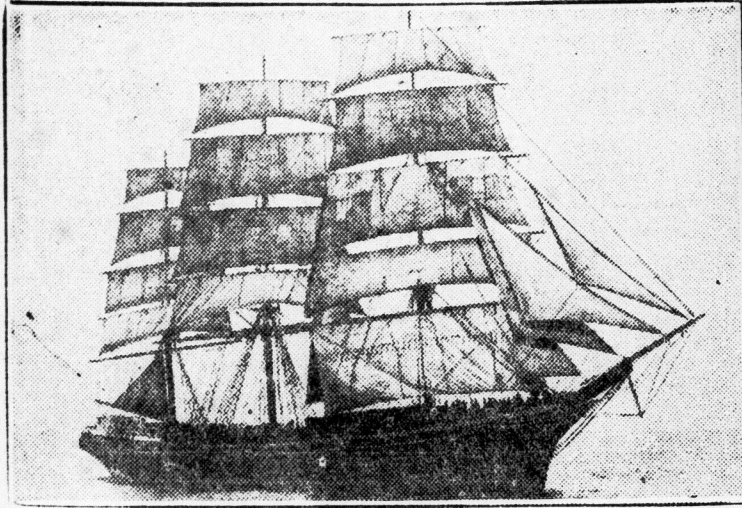

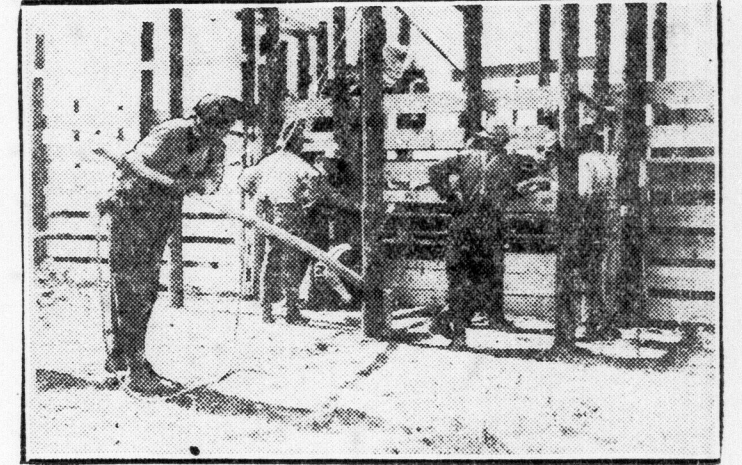

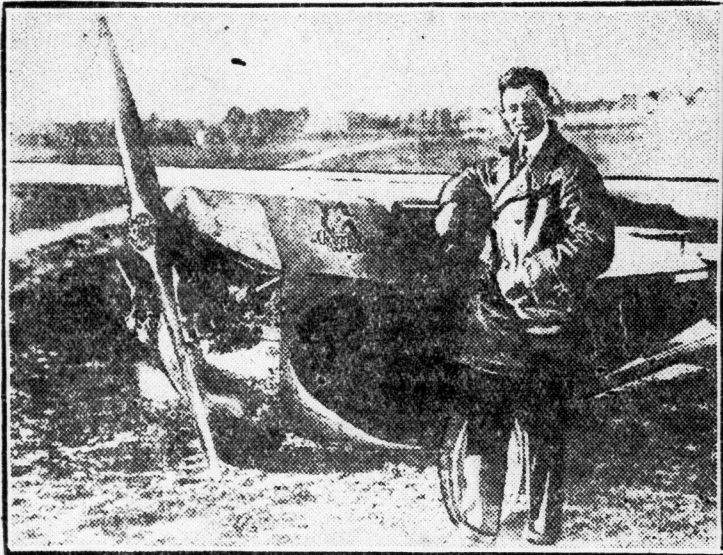
Darrel Figgis, noted Irish patriot, poet, author, journalist and member of parliament, who ended his life in London recently. He was one of Erin's most picturesque figures.

Dr. Cheng Ting Wang, former Chinese premier and Yale graduate, who heads the Chinese statesmen at the Peking tariff conference.

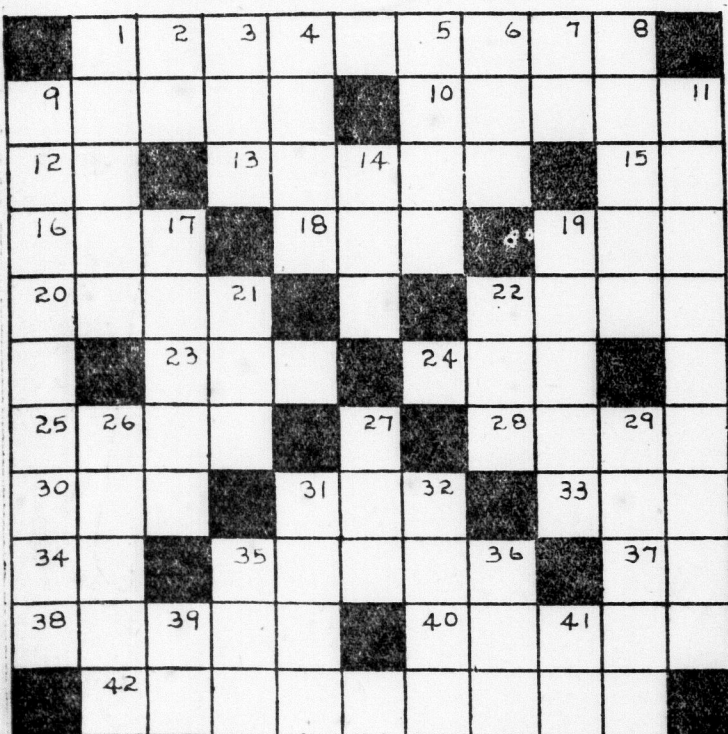


The ring watch, one of the latest fads introduced at Deauville. The young lady is Miss Doris Bock of New York.

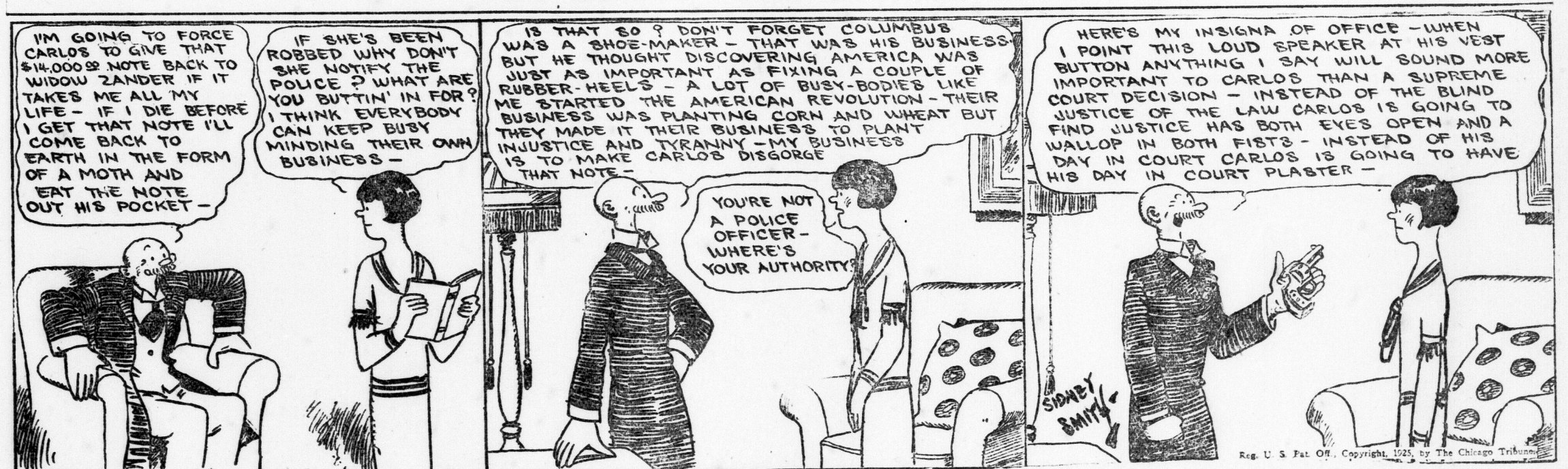
