The appeal case of Robertson v. Robertson came up before Chief Justice Galt and Justices MacMahon and Ross yesterday. The defendant appealed yesterday and their lordships quashed the conviction on the following grounds: (1) That Robertson had offered to support his wife if she returned to him; (2) that the proper place for a wife is at her husband's side, and the husband is not bound to support her unless she lives with him; (3) that a citizen of the United States cannot be sued in Canada for non-support of his wife.


