London, May 24.—Mr. James E. Hudthe chief promoter of the Canadian mail route to Australia via England, Pacific mail route to Australia via England, said to-day in an interview with a representative of the United Press, that the British Government had not promised to grant a subsidy to the new line, but he was very hopeful that they would grant one. Mr. Huddart says the expectation is to put ships on the new line as fast as they can be built, the vessels of the Atlantic and Pacific lines to be owned by the same company. He will sail on June 9 on board the steamship New York on his way to Ottawa.
