



Competitors take advantage of our terms and misrepresent the quality of our twine. Altogether the outlook is discouraging. We should be able to run the mill all the year. Give us the retail dealers-give us the mar-ket on equal terms with our competitors-and we, will sell all the twine we make if we run our factory right and day every month of the year.
