25,000 New Settlers for Canada Under S. A. Auspices.

As a successful Immigration Agency the Salvation Army has come into great prominence, and during the past four years about twenty thousand people have been directed to this country through the agency of this world-wide organization. Sixty per cent. of these have been placed in Ontario, 30 per cent. in the North-West, and the remainder in Quebec and the Maritime Provinces.

Thirteen thousand persons came to Canada under the auspices of the army last year, and were selected from a possible one hundred thousand applicants. These figures convince us of the fact that great discretion is used in the selection. During the coming season, 1907, it is estimated that fully 25,000 persons will avail themselves of the Army's Immigration facilities, and book passages to Canada. The entire accommodation of three steamers has been chartered for the season, besides all available accommodation on Dominion, Allan and C. P. R. Steamship Lines.

The majority of the new-comers will be available for engagement as Farm Laborers, Teamsters, Navvies, Quarrymen, Railway Construction Workers, Factory and General Laborers, and Farmers and others desiring the services of same will do well to apply to Brigadier Howell, James and Albert St., Toronto, for Application Forms.

If house accommodation can be furnished, married men with growing families are specially recommended as being more permanent and stable. Farmers are recommended to apply for married men when possible.

East Lambton County Council.

Presentment of Grand Jury.—In the Court of General Sessions of the Peace, County of Lambton, Ontario, at the County Court, Jan. 13, 1907.

We have gone carefully over the various County Buildings and beg to report: Registry Office.—This building and furnishings are modern and first class, everything that can be desired and a credit to the County in every respect.

County Offices.—These we find equally good in every respect, commodious, well lighted, heated and ventilated.

House of Refuge.—This we find clean, well kept and comfortable, the inmates apparently satisfied and contented with their surroundings.

Hospital.—This really necessary institution is well managed, carefully and economically conducted. We recommend that some minor improvements be made at an early date, such as resurfacing the basement floor, the supplying of two lines of hose or two fire extinguishers for the basement.

Jail and Court House.—These buildings are the only blot on the fair name of Lambton. We strongly advise that a new court house be taken into consideration immediately. With an assessment of over thirty millions of dollars this would not prove a burden to the people.

The buildings as at present are antiquated, poorly lighted, poorly heated and poorly ventilated. The buildings are as clean and well kept as it is possible to keep them under the existing conditions.

In a rare opinion that if the entire content and management of the jail were placed with the Ontario government it would be much more satisfactory than the present dual control by the County and Province. All of which is respectfully submitted. J. A. MACKENZIE, Foreman.

Prison Twine Unsaleable.

According to Warden Platt, of the Kingston penitentiary, satisfactory results have not followed the marketing of binder twine at the factory. "We started in last year with about 350 tons, states the warden. "We sold about 200 tons—less than half our possible output. Our twine was as good as any on the market. Our price was two cents below other twine of the same grade. But our terms shut us out, and our twine will always shut us out. Farmers will not send cash for any article they cannot see, and many of them cannot see cash because they have not got it. To get up clubs costs money and increases the price of the twine. Competitors take advantage of our terms and misrepresent the quality of our twine. Altogether the outlook is discouraging. We should be able to run the mill all the year. Give us the retail dealers—give us the market on equal terms with our competitors—and we will sell all the twine we make if we run our factory night and day every month of the year. If we cannot have the market, why run the factory? All this I say, after five years' experience with the present system."
