RAINS DAMAGE CROPS.

Bad News From the County of Essex-Everything But Spring Grain Seriously Affected.

Everything But Spring Grain Seriously Affected.

Windsor, June 29,—Reports from different parts of Essex County state that the heavy rains of Friday night and Saturday did great damage to crops. In mapy places corn was washed out of the ground, and some of it is so broken that it was ruined. The greatest loss will be in the wheat and hay crops. The hay was beaten to the ground, and as it is really to cut there will be whole fields ruined on account of rust, which appeared as soon as the sun came out warm. In many places it was so lodged that it will be almost impossible to cut it with a mower. The wheat was broken in such a way that it will not ripen and will therefore be a total loss. The spring crops were not far enough advanced to be materially damaged by the heavy downpour. Vegetables also suffered, as in many places the plants were completely washed out of the ground. Tobacco did not escape, as it was only planted recently and did not have sufficient growth to withstand the rain.
