

Miscellaneous.

The proclamation of Italy's neutrality has been issued.

It is exactly two hundred years ago (1777) that Russia declared war for the first time with the Porte.

An extensive conflagration occurred at Constantinople, Saturday the 29th inst., by which 600 houses were burned.

The river Danube has overflowed at Krenatchuk, which is completely flooded. Twenty thousand inhabitants are homeless.

Tax is paid in Great Britain on a million and a quarter of dogs, being a licensed dog to every twenty-five inhabitants.

The Newfoundland seal fishery for this year promises to be one of the most successful on record. About 400,000 having been taken at last accounts.

A Calcutta despatch states that a serious outbreak of cholera has occurred in Akyab. Twenty-five per cent. of the children of the European population died within thirty days.

Agents of several foreign powers are at Washington, U. S., to purchase lumber for shipbuilding. Two cargoes were recently shipped to France, and it is said more will be purchased for Great Britain.

Russia has warned the Khedive of Egypt against sending troops to aid the Sultan. France has warned him against diverting any of the sums he has set apart for his creditors, to such purpose.

A Sailing Schooner Lost with Fourteen Lives.—The sailing schooner, *Nauticus* of Herring Neck, Nfld., was capsized in Green Bay, and of eighteen persons on board fourteen on board fourteen were lost.—*Chronicle*.

The Swedish painter, Carl Petter Lehmann, who painted four thousand eight hundred portraits, is dead in his eighty-fourth year. There will probably be an exhibition of his works in Stockholm.

The steamer *John Bromall*, which sailed from New York last Saturday, left about 40 persons behind, who desired to take passage, as she carried a million dollars worth of guns for Turkey. Those persons, it is believed, were to capture her at sea.

In Adair county, Ky., 35 years ago, a vein of coal was struck, 35 feet thick, at a depth of 80 feet. Ten or twelve years ago, another vein of coal was struck 40 feet thick, at 40 feet depth. Some years ago another vein, 43 feet thick was found.

Anchor Line.—Steamship "Scotia," the Anchor Line, arrived at Glasgow Wednesday 25th inst., from St. John. She will load in Glasgow, sailing thence 5th of May, calling at Liverpool and sailing from there the 9th of May for Halifax and St. John. Importers should forward orders without delay.

The Augusta "Chronicle" says Massachusetts capitalists are investing in manufacturing enterprises in Georgia. A cotton mill is to be established at Augusta and another on the "Powder Mill tract," the first to run 20,000 and the latter 60,000.

Nearly twenty thousand tons of American roofing plate were sent last week to England and Ireland, and found a ready market. Several shipments were made direct to Cardiff, Wales, the greater centre of the trade of the world. The shipments during the present year bid fair to be much larger than last.

The last surviving English officer who was present at the battle of Copenhagen, April 2, 1801, is Admiral Philip Westrial, the oldest commissioned officer in the navy, who lives at Ryde at the age of 96. He entered the navy in 1794; was master of the *Blanche* during the battle, and was made lieutenant three days afterward.

Information has been received in New York of the massacre of the Rev. W. Wolfe, Moravian missionary at Lanco Settlement. Laborer, together with his family, consisting of his son Erard and his daughters, Charlotte and Anne. The deed was perpetrated by four Esquimaux who had been refused rum at his mission.

In the event of a European war, the island of Perin, situated at the gate of the Red Sea, and commanding the sea-way from the Mediterranean to the Indian Ocean, would be a second Gibraltar. England first took possession of the island in 1799, abandoned it two years later, and recaptured it in 1857 much to the chagrin of the French.

The coroner's verdict in the case of the St. Louis Hotel fire censures the hotel proprietor for having no system for the use of fire appliances; for keeping on hand a large amount of inflammable material without adequate care for removing the fire alarm from the office; for employing only one watchman; for a general lack of care and watchfulness; and for not making any exertion to alarm the guests on the night of the fire.

ROMANTIC SUICIDES.

Two human beings, tightly fastened together by means of a strong cord, were taken from the River Seine at Rouen. They were those of a young man of twenty, named Henri Dominois, and a maiden of eighteen, named Eliza Dupre, his sweetheart. Henri was the son of M. Dominois, who occupies a position in life and fortune as a simple work girl, pretty and honest, with whom he fell desperately in love. A letter, found in the pockets of the young man, told in a few words their short but tragic story. "Our parents," it said, "would not allow us to marry and we resolved to perish together, in order that we might not be separated in Paradise." The bodies had remained in the river from March 6, when the young people disappeared from their respective homes.

EUROPE.

WAR COMMENCED!

London, April 26.—The Porte's request for modification of the Powers has been completely unsuccessful.

Yesterday 10,000 Russians occupied the railway bridge at Chiosch. Up to yesterday evening 50,000 Russians had entered Rumanian territory. The Turks up to that time remained perfectly passive on the banks of Danube.

Constantinople, April 25.—This evening the Russians, who have entered Asiatic Turkey, appear to intend attacking Kurs.

News of an engagement on the Asiatic frontier is momentarily expected. Rumor has it that the Russian army of the Danube. He has sent a telegraphic despatch to the Commander-in-Chief, with orders to read to the people.

The Rumanian army has returned from the Danube into the interior, where it divided into two bodies, one at Bucharest, the other at Kiova.

The inhabitants of both banks of the Danube are fleeing en masse into the interior.

Bucharest, April 25.—The Turks are leaving Vidin in great haste, in the direction of Dolmecha, where they appear to expect the principal Russian attack.

The Russian continue to enter Rumanian territory in great numbers. The Russian head quarters will be transferred to Jassy in a few days.

London, April 26.—The *Past* publishes the following prominently:—"We hear that British officers on leave have been requested to rejoin their regiments." The British fleet at Malta will proceed Eastward.

The *Past* says: "There was a Cabinet Council yesterday and another will be held to-day. This is significant of anxious discussion and weighty determination. The subject of discussion is probably the reply to Gortschakoff's circulars."

London, April 25.—The "Standard" special says the Turks crossed the Danube Wednesday at several points, and sent out flying corps to destroy the railways before the advance of the Russians.

The Car has sent the Emperor of Austria an autograph letter repeating his assurances that Russia wishes no annexation.

It is announced from Tiflis that the Russian Caucasian army commenced operations to-day, marching in two columns towards Erzerum and Batoum.

Kafala has been evacuated. All Rumanian troops go to Bucharest.

The Porte has asked Serbia for a permit for Turkish troops to traverse Serbian territory in order to cross the Danube between Glavara and Radevatz. The Serbian Government replied that strict neutrality will be observed, unless the Turkish violate or cross the Serbian frontier.

The Russian imperial family have given 400,000 roubles from their private purse for the expenses of the war.

Madrid, April 25.—Alfonso opened the Cortes to-day. His speech declared the relations of Spain with the foreign Powers more cordial than ever.

Liverpool, April 26.—The Porte has determined to appeal to the Powers under the treaty of Paris, against the action of Russia.

A little has taken place between the Turks and Montenegrins. The latter were defeated and the former advanced to Niscie. The Montenegrins were utterly routed.

The Turks are preparing to march in the direction of Debrudze to receive the Russian attack.

The Russians have taken Galatz and occupy Bolgrad.

Paris, April 26.—The Russian telegraphic agency announces that the Rumanian Parliament will declare war against Turkey.

All the Turkish vessels will be embargoed by the Russians on the first of May.

Constantinople, April 26.—The Turkish troops are reported to have occupied Kafala.

ATHENS, April 26.—The Greek inhabitants of Isakhyria have refused to obey the call for extraordinary reserve.

London, April 26.—Turkey's reply to the Russian manifesto, after quoting the article of the Treaty of Paris, says: "Although it is not the Ottoman Government which has refused to accept all mis-understanding, it applies to the signatory powers to use their good offices in the grave circumstances in which it is placed by applying the article before mentioned, and to put an end to the dangerous tension affecting the relations of two States. The Porte expresses its conviction that the friendly powers, true to the feeling of benevolence which they never ceased to manifest toward the Ottoman Empire, will seize the opportunity to prevent the outbreak of a great war."

Not a shot was fired up to five o'clock yesterday.

The greater part of the Russian troops are going in the direction of Bolgrad, to apparently enough a passage through Dobruza, which, it is stated, is expected to be the object of the principal attack. It is thought doubtful that the Turks can prevent the passage of the Russian army.

Constantinople, April 26.—The Journal *Yechin*, the Russian admirals party organ, admits the impossibility of the Russian Black Sea fleet opposing Turkish iron-clads, but says: "The Turks will be unable to effect a landing, as all accessible points are being protected by fortifications and torpedoes. The Turks will be in the same position as the French were in the Baltic in 1870—as the Turks will constantly have to despatch part of their fleet to fetch supplies from the Bosphorus—opportunities may arise for Russian torpedo boats to do effective service."

Constantinople, April 26.—Salvet Pasha has addressed the following despatch to the Turkish Ambassador at London:—"The first engagement has just been fought at Tebrukon near Batoum. After some fighting the enemy was defeated and put to rout with loss of 800."

Paris, April 26.—A despatch from Ragusa states that the Prince of Montenegro has sent a note to the Powers, accusing the Turcs of having broken off negotiations because Montenegro required that refugees from Herzegovina should be restored to their homes, and Christian prisoners liberated. The Prince declares that alone, without allies, but relying on the abnegation of his subjects, he will defend his territory; if defeated he trusts in Christian Europe to save the women and children.

Bucharest, April 26.—No news received up to 5 o'clock, p. m., of any engagement.

The number of Russians who have entered Rumania is estimated at 80,000. They are concentrating at Barbochi. No Russian have crossed the Danube at Danube. This telegram confirms the report that the Russians are apparently advancing upon Dobrochra.

London, April 27.—3.30 p. m.—The Russians have been twice defeated at Batoum.

London, April 28.—The town of Poli was bombarded and burned by the Turks. Five German correspondents were expelled from Kishineff, after being subjected to inhuman treatment.

Public feeling inclines more and more

UNITED STATES.

New York, April 29.—The "Herald" correspondent at St. Petersburg telegraphs that intense enthusiasm prevails throughout the Czar's dominions. Russia has 300,000 men on the Danube, and 125,000 men in the Caucasus, while the opposing forces of the Turks are 100,000 along the Danube, and 60,000 or less in Asia Minor. Both sides exhibit weakness in skilled generals, and the position in Rumania is unfortunate.
