Doctor A. H. Hall was born at Mount Tranquil, Leeds, Megantic Co. P. Q., July 8th, 1871, where he resided till he graduated from the Leeds Model School, and received his certificate in 1887. At the age of sixteen he left for British Columbia and the next year took a commercial course and diploma. He then entered McGill Faculty of Comparative Medicine and graduated with honors on March 29th, 1894, and received the degree of Doctor of Veterinary Science, after which he practised in Leeds till the death of Dr. Cummings, in March, 1896, when he came to Quebec and commenced his profession as successor to the late Dr. P. Cummings. Also examiner of the Province for the Faculty of Comparative Medicine of McGill University, and in January, 1906, he was elected to the position of President of the City of Quebec Agricultural Society, which is the oldest in the Dominion.
