

ions strongly and gives his experience (and experience is the true teacher,) as follows:—

“The good results that were to crown our labors, being of the opinion that if we would take the same birds and feed them properly after separating them from the hens we would get as good results. We took a light Brahma-Plymouth Rock cross and caponized six of them. At the same time we took six of the same cross, separated them from the pullets and fed them on food that we thought would make them grow rapidly and take on flesh. After three or four days we fed the caponized fowls exactly the same as those that had not been operated upon, and as I had predicted at the start the ones that were not caponized weighed heavier than the ones that were.”

Not a very good showing for the result of a painful operation. It is yet to be shown that caponizing is a success financially, and until demonstrated it is not an experiment for beginners to go into.
