being pulverized by the winter frosts, in the spring, is the best remedy. This, with the use of old manure,—that which has lain a year or more, and been frequently turned over till it becomes thoroughly decayed,-will keep the garden in good condition. No unvarying rules can be given: much must be left to the judgment of the amateur. He must understand that the soil of a good garden shoold be deep, well pulverized, friable, and rich, and if the opposite, to make it as near that as possible.

When the flower-garden is to be a specialty, -a piece of ground set apart for that object, and laid out in geometrical order, and all the beds edged with box or thrift,-then more pains ought to be taken; and those who are about to do this, if they have not the requisite information, will consult something more than a catalogue.
