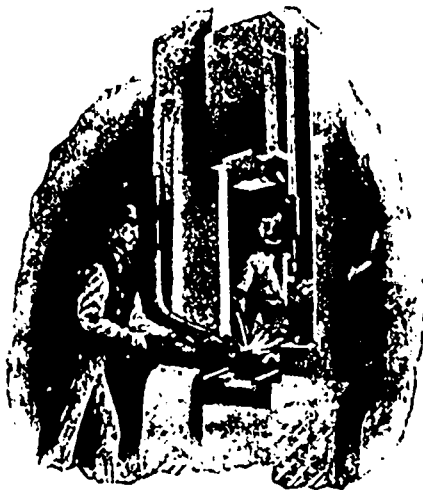


Scientific Forging and High Grade Bicycles.

Many makers use a malleable casting or a sheet steel stamping costing but a few cents. For instance, the crank hanger bracket in the rough weighs seventy ounces, and when drilled and machined ready for brazing its weight is but *twelve ounces*—a costly but a sure way of making a good job. 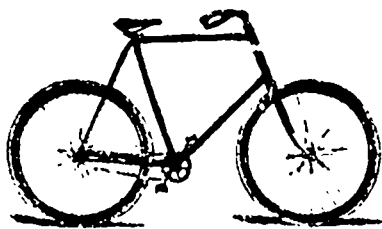
