RECOMMENDATION 1

The Standing Committee recommends that the Standing Senate Committee on Legal and Constitutional Affairs, which requires mandatory training requirements be established, moving the Senate, be requested to consult with The Canadian Bar Association that the remaining requirement be imposed nationally on all first-time P.A.C. applicants to sign off, if possible. This should be done after consultation with the provinces, but in any event no later than June 1992. The training requirement, it should also be mentioned to provide that all first-time applicants sign successfully complete a written exam, covering all aspects of the application process, and that the exam be based on national standards.
