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"That the House do resolve itself into a Committee of the Whole to consider the following resolution:—That it is expedient to provide that so far as the concurrence of the Parliament of Canada may be necessary for the purpose, the Legislature of the Province of Ontario or the Province of Quebec shall be authorized and empowered to provide that the votes of the electors under the Act of the late Province of Canada, 27 and 28 Vict., chap. 18, therein called the Temperance Act, and commonly known as the Dunkin Act, shall be given by ballot in such manner as the Provincial Legislature may direct, subject to such provisions and changes only as may be deemed necessary for the purpose, but retaining all the provisions of the Act, which are not inconsistent with the voting by ballot."—(Mr. Robinson).	1367
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
