URBAN RENEWAL—FREEZING OF FEDERAL ASSISTANCE

Question No. 4—Mr. Gilbert:

1. On what date this past summer did the Minister responsible for Housing announce a freeze of federal government assistance for urban renewal projects?

2. On what date were cities and municipalities in Canada informed of the federal government's decision in this matter?

3. On what date were the provincial governments informed of the federal government's decision in this matter?

Hon. Robert K. Andras (Minister without Portfolio): 1. On August 14, 1969, the Minister responsible for Housing issued a public statement which in part indicated that "Until a more well-defined and logical long-term Canadian urban renewal policy can be formulated and enunciated, municipalities with urban renewal schemes presently in preparation will have to elect either to suspend further study or, alternatively, to complete their work in the knowledge that additional federal funds for implementation of the schemes may or may not be forthcoming." Discussions with the provincial governments during the summer dealt with the urban renewal program among other matters of mutual interest and the provincial and municipal officials concerned were notified officially of the government's decision immediately after the public announcement.

URBAN RENEWAL—BAN ON PLANS

Question No. 5—Mr. Gilbert:

1. Is there presently a ban on all urban renewal plans in Canada financed by the Government of Canada?

2. When is it expected that the Government of Canada will formulate its policy on urban renewal projects?

Which urban renewal plans submitted to the federal government have been affected or cancelled by the suspension of all urban renewal projects funded by the Government of Canada?

Hon. Robert K. Andras (Minister without Portfolio): The processing of applications for financial assistance for urban renewal studies, the preparation of urban renewal schemes and the implementation of urban renewal schemes, was suspended following the announcement of August 14, 1969.
