NATIONAL DEFENCE—PURCHASE OF HOMES AS A  
RESULT OF CLOSURE OF CFB, GIMLI.Question No. 1,628—**Mr. Rowland:**

What is the total cost, actual and projected, to the government, of purchasing private dwellings and compensating for early termination of long-term rental agreements resulting from the closure of CFB Gimli?

**Hon. Donald S. Macdonald (Minister of National Defence):** The purchase of 44 private dwellings at CFB Gimli was approved in the amount of \$419,000. It is anticipated that the cost to the Crown will not exceed \$200,000. Sale of the properties through Crown Assets Disposal Corporation also will reimburse the Crown in part for the purchases. A long term rental agreement will be assigned or terminated when negotiations with the owner have been completed.

Lang (Minister of Manpower and Immigration):** The attached table provides Department of Manpower and Immigration statistics on placements, excluding casuals, by province for the fiscal years 1970-1971, 1969-1970, 1968-1969, 1967-1968, 1966-1967 and National Employment Service statistics for the fiscal years 1965-1966 and 1964-1965. Placement data for the Northwest Territories and the Yukon are listed for the years 1970-1971 and 1969-1970. For the fiscal years prior to 1969-1970, the Northwest Territories are consolidated with Alberta and the Yukon is consolidated with British Columbia.
