FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE TO SKI RESORTS IN QUEBEC

Question No. 4,958—**Mr. Herbert:**

1. In the past five years, did the Government contribute financial assistance or guarantees for any ski resorts in Quebec and, if so, what amount was given or loaned, to whom and under what conditions of repayment?

2. (a) Was a request made for government financial assistance for the ski resort on Rigaud Mountain in Quebec (b) was the request denied and, if so, for what reason?

Hon. Ed Lumley (Minister of Industry, Trade and Commerce and Minister of Regional Economic Expansion): 1. In the past five years, the Departments of Regional Economic Expansion and Industry Trade and Commerce have not allowed Quebec ski resorts any loan guarantees. The Departments have, however, granted financial assistance for five projects in the form of non-repayable subsidies as follows:

Mont Tremblant (1980-81-82) through the Subsidiary Agreement on Tourism Development	\$8,000,000
Thetford Ski Club (1982-83) Special employment-related initiative	\$ 311,000
Mont Fortin Ski Club Inc. (1983-84) Special employment-related initiative	\$ 300,000
Chikanki Ski Resort (1982-83) Special employment-related initiative	\$ 20,500
Petite Rivière Saint-François (1982-83) For an audio-visual presentation of the region	\$ 23,000
