A Member cannot rise on a point of order to move a motion – except for a motion that a Member be now heard.

I refer to the Annotated Standing Orders, page 459, footnote No. 1:

Although Members cannot move motions when recognized on a point of order (Beauchesne, 5th ed., p. 78), if the Chair has not recognized a Member to move a motion "That a Member be now heard"—

—and goes on to discuss that particular exception. I have tried to accommodate hon. members and give the reason for the order, and as I have said before, if there are practices here that hon. members do not agree with in terms of our rules and procedures then of course there is a time and place to decide to change them if possible. I think I have to say that the ruling I made must stand.

I want to point out something else. This ruling is on the narrow point as to whether or not the hon. member could move the motion on a point of order. That is all it is. There may be another discussion with respect to what it was the hon. member from Kamloops wanted to do.
