

Daily lists of bills referred to committees posted in lobby

97. The Clerk shall cause lists of all private bills to be prepared daily by the clerks of the committees to which the same are referred, and the time and place of each committee meeting shall be specified in such lists which shall be posted in the lobby of the Senate.

Attendance before committee

98. Any person whose interests may be affected by a private bill

(a) may appear before the committee to which such bill has been referred or may make comments to the committee in writing;

(b) if required to do so by the committee, shall appear before the committee.

Reference to committee of the whole

99. Unless the Senate otherwise orders, a private bill reported from a select committee shall not be referred to a committee of the whole.

Important amendments

100. An important amendment may not be proposed to any private bill in a committee of the whole or on the motion for third reading of the bill unless notice of the same shall have been given on a previous day.

Commons amendments

101. When a private bill is returned from the House of Commons with important amendments, such amendments, previous to their consideration by the Senate, shall be referred to a committee of the whole or to the select committee to which such bill was originally referred.

Rules as to public bills to apply

102. Except as herein otherwise provided, the rules relating to public bills apply to private bills.

PART VIII

GENERAL

Transmission of messages

103. The Clerk of the Senate shall arrange for the transmission of messages from the Senate to the House of Commons and for the reception by the Senate of messages from the House of Commons.
