INDUSTRIAL BRIDGE FOR AKRON, O.

The business men of Akron, Ohio, are planning the construction of a remarkable reinforced-concrete, high-level viaduct. The plan, simply stated, is to erect a line of industrial buildings, 2583 ft. long by 60 ft. wide, across the valley separating the heart of the city from the section known as North Hill and use the roof as a bridge. The total cost is estimated at \$554,000, and the floor space available for rental would be about \$73,000 square feet.

According to the plans, as at present drawn, there will be a sidewalk, 8 feet wide, on one side of the bridge, and on the other side there will be seven freight elevators connecting the overhead roadway with the cross streets and with the factories. On the top story of the building, just under the roadway, will be a rallway, enabling the occupants to load and unload goods under their own roof. The building will have its own "over and heating plant, which will be sufficiently large to furnish heat and light for the entire down town district.

It is believed that the considerable amount of convenient and economical floor space could be depended upon to persuade many new industries to locate in Akron.
