

ORGANIC UNION BEFORE ASSEMBLY
Fight Again On Between Advocates and Opponents of Scheme.

NOTHING CAN STOP IT
If Union Is of God—Federation Only, Says the Minority.

It was not to attend a funeral of the Presbyterian Church in Canada that the thousands of ministers and elders came here, was an electric declaration at the general assembly yesterday afternoon.

Rev. Dr. Scott of Montreal appeared almost astounded at the storm of applause his satirical metaphor caused. Then the rival sides, unionists and federalists, gave opposing roars of approval.

The volume of applause in support of the minority report demonstrated that the union committee had been working together with a view to union. In many western cities union congregations and Congregationalists had been formed.

Rev. Dr. W. J. Clark of Montreal, moved the adoption of the majority report. The majority recommended that the union committee be continued, but it may again enter into conference with the committees of the other negotiating churches.
