The wheat market was slightly lower today. The trading was of a very light calibre and frequently extremely dull. An
absence of outside business was the feature. From the start there was a heavy
undertone. Sentiment was somewhat bearish, being influenced by generally even teaor of favorable crop news. To-day all was
sumshine and high promise of bountiful
crop. Hot forcing weather, all that could
be desired, prevailed, giving anticipations
of early crop antedating the danger line
of frost. The winter wheat crop is practically assured, the rains during harvesting having caused a temporary retardation
rather than any special damage. The Government weekly crop bulletin was generally very favorable. The market abroad
offers only discouragement by lower quotations, and reported very favorable crop
weather and excellent crop outlook. The
wheat movement in Northwest is small.
There was the bullishness of hopeful news
that the activity in the stock market and
other speculative markets might extend into the grain markef, but a higher stock
market, based on enlarged crop prospects,
is usually a bear argument in grain circles. This was instanced noticeably in the
weakness in spot and July wheat, accentuating the bearish sentiment. This year
probably will follow, all precedent, a freer
consumptive and export demand being offset by the freer movement of the new crop
supplies and at lower values. To-day, more
than ever, it is claimed if prices cannot
be maintained on decreasing supplies there
is less reason to expect imprévement on
freer movement and accumulations.


