OFF ON THE VICTORIAN.

Mounted Rifles and Field Hospital
Corps Now Afloat.

Halifax, Jan. 28.—Hundreds of people crowded the wharves to-day to give a last cheer to the 2nd Battalion of the C.M.R., as the Victorian weighed anchor and set sail for South Africa. The men were inspected this morning and presented a splendid appearance as they marched thru the gates of the old camp ground for the last time, singing and shouting good-bye to friends among the spectators. Telegrams of farewell were received by Col. Evans from Regina, signifying the "Men of the West," from Lord Minto and many others.

CARNegie ON WAR.

Tells What Is the Foullest Blot Upon Humanity.

New York, Jan. 28.—"The killing of men under the name of war," wrote Andrew Carnegie in a letter which was read at the P. F. Collier dinner at the Metropolitan club last night, "is the foulest blot upon humanity to-day. There can be no such thing as civilized warfare. As a general proposition it may be stated that the nation which refuses peaceful arbitration is responsible for the war which ensues. Britain, having done this in its dispute with the Transvaal Republic, is responsible for the extermination of brave and heroic Christian people. But let us also remember that we are to-day engaged in shooting down Christian Filipinos, whose only crime is that they believe in the declaration of independence. So that both branches of the so-called most highly civilized are guilty of the most un-civilized crimes. Let us all pray that this disgrace is soon to pass away."

Her Hand Was Crushed.

In the Civil Justice yesterday, Chief Justice Falconbridge and a jury continued the hearing of the action of Miss Annie Wooster against the Puritan Laundry. She was awarded \$200 because she lost the use of her left hand, which was crushed by a hot iron between two hot rollers. The evidence had not all been presented when the court adjourned.
