### BRITISH SHIPPING INTERESTS.

Decline of Progress Due to Circumstances Other Than Subsidization.

London, June 6.—Sir Robert Giffen, ex-President of the Statistical Society, and ex-Chief of the Board of Trade, testifying to-day before the House of Commons Committee on Steamship Subsidies, said the changes in the position of British shipping, compared with those of other countries, was due largely to circumstances apart from subsidization. There had been a diminution of British progress, while elsewhere, especially in Germany, there had been a great advance. The number of American-owned ships sailing under the British flag, quite apart from those with the combine recently formed, had largely increased, and was still increasing, and he regarded it as obvious that, notwithstanding the fact that the White Star Line steamers were sailing under the British flag, the United States government regarded them as being American vessels and would be prepared to defend them, as the property of American citizens.

Sir Robert said he regarded subsidies as a political, rather than an economic question.

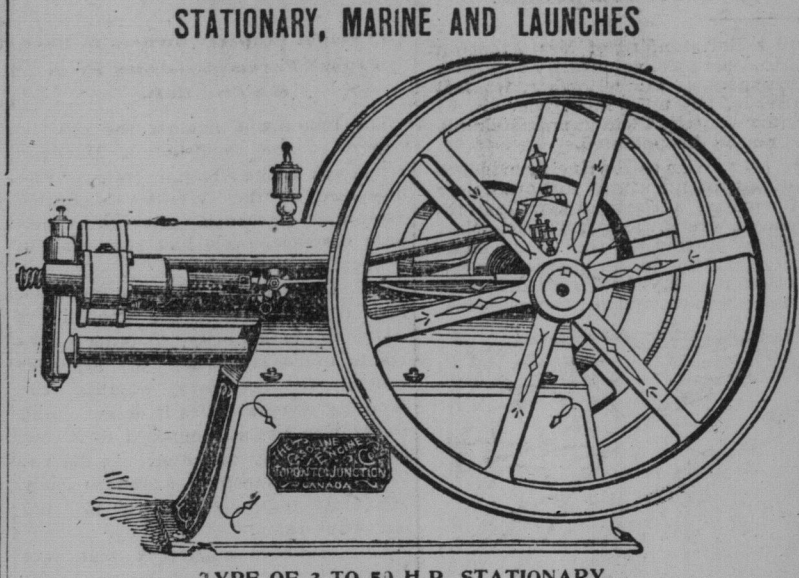

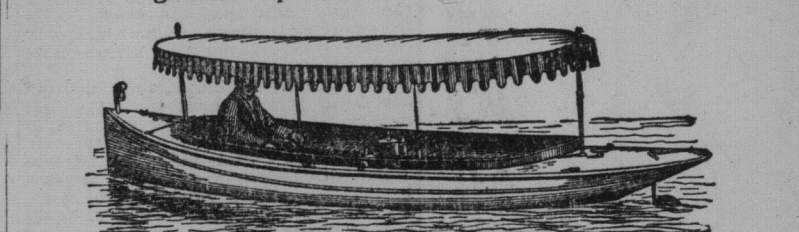
