Many Large Consignments
Have Been Laid Away
at Chatham.

POLICE INVESTIGATING

Prosecutions May Follow
Rumors of Too Much
Celebrating.

CHATHAM, March 31.—The express
companies were unable to deliver within
the last two days. Some large stocks of
"medicine" have been laid in by people
who already some of the goods have
been circulating that celebrations have
exceeded the law. The authorities will
investigate, and if any truth is found
in the rumors there will be some pro-
secutions in the next few days. The
authorities are placing a liberal inter-
pretation on the law, but will not allow
disorder and flagrant transgression of
the regulations.

FIRST CRISIS PAST, BUT MORE SMASHES SURE TO BE MADE

England Prepares for Another
and More Desperate
Assault.

LINE IS SOLIDIFYING

German Plan of Dividing the
Allied Armies Has Failed
Absolutely.

LONDON, March 31.—The week ended
with a feeling of optimism, which has
been progressively growing during the
past three days, over the prospects of
the battle being fought in the West.
Great crisis is past and the enemy is
held for the time being, there is no
belief that he is beaten, unless some
factor like the weather should bar his
further attacks.

The country is prepared for another,
and perhaps more than one, desperate
assault on the Allied lines before
Amiens and Paris. Since the German
higher command has announced to the
people that this was the decisive battle,
either the German plan of dividing the
Allied line is a failure, or the Allies
will be an admission of defeat.

The Press Association tonight says:
"The German plan of dividing the
Allied line is a failure. The British
position is solidifying very rapidly. We are
now ready to meet any attack which
the enemy may make. There is no anxiety
on account of the division of the front."
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
