REPEATED ASSAULTS BY AUSTRIANS REPULSED

ROME, March 21.—"In the Trentino yesterday," says the official statement issued today by the Italian war department, "there again was considerable artillery activity. On Cristoforo Massini, after a violent bombardment with gas shells, the enemy repeatedly attacked our advanced positions. He was repulsed with heavy loss."

"The usual artillery actions and patrol encounters were reported on the Julian front. Two of our patrols entered the enemy lines in the Gorizia area and destroyed them."

"An enemy airplane was brought down in flames by our fire in the vicinity of Loquizza. The aviators were killed."

SIXTH GERMAN LOAN IS GOING ABEGGING

LONDON, March 21.—A Hague dispatch from the correspondent of the Exchange Telegraph Company says: "The German ministry of finance is organizing a great canvassing campaign for the sixth German war loan, which in financial circles, is considered less successful than the previous war loan, the subscriptions being one-third lower. Berlin and Frankfurt bankers openly state that the present failure shows the uselessness of launching a seventh loan."

NINETEEN ATTACKS BY SUBMARINES IN WEEK ARE FAILURES

Official British Statement of
Ship Movements.

OVER 5,000 COME OR GO

24 Merchantmen and 21
Fishing Vessels Are
Sunk.

LONDON, March 21.—A British official communication issued this evening says that for the week ending March 18 sixteen British ships each of a tonnage of more than 1,000 tons were sunk, and eight of a tonnage under 1,000 tons. Twenty-one fishing vessels also were sunk.

The communication also gives the number of vessels arriving and sailing from United Kingdom ports during this period. It says:

"For the week ending March 18, merchant vessels of all nationalities of over 100 tons, exclusive of fishing boats, arrived at United Kingdom ports: Arrivals, 2,528; sailings, 2,354.

"British merchantmen sunk by mine or submarine, of 1,000 tons gross or over, 15; under 1,000 tons, 8.

"British fishing vessels unsuccessfully attacked, including one during the week ending March 11, 19.

"British fishing vessels sunk, including 17 sailers, 21."

ANCHOR LINER ESCAPES.

NEW YORK, March 21.—Passengers on the Anchor Line S.S. Tuscania which arrived here today from Glasgow, said that on Monday, March 12, when about 300 miles out from the Scotch coast, the Tuscania encountered a German submarine. By putting on full speed and steering a zigzag course the Tuscania escaped.

The passengers said they were ordered to put on their lifebelts and stand by the lifeboats for three hours.

FINDS HOME ABLAZE AND 31 STARK-NAKED PERSONS GAZING ON

Doukhobor Band Claims God
Ordered Them to Burn
"Rich Residences."

SASKATOON, March 21.—Charged with setting fire to the \$15,000 home of Peter Verigin, near the village of Orendine, during a "naked pilgrimage" last July, five Doukhobors arrested by the provincial police have been committed for trial at Kamsack. Paul Strynck, W. Resansky, S. Kalesnikoff, A. Mahoroff and P. Vorkin insisted that God had told them to destroy the house.

Verigin told the court that when he heard of the crime he drove out to his farm and found eleven men, ten women, two girls and eight children, all naked, standing around the conflagration. One man had told him that God had ordered them to fire the building, and that they were going to burn down all the "rich residences."

The men were arrested last July while on a nude pilgrimage.

TOLD TO EAT CORPSE.

SASKATOON, March 21.—Five Doukhobors were yesterday committed for trial on a charge of having committed an "indignity to the human body." They are alleged to have taken a naked corpse on a sleigh and left it standing in the village square at Orendine, Sask., after having invited Mike W. Czakoff, leader of an opposition faction, to come out and eat it.

BIG SUMS FOR QUEEN'S.

KINGSTON, March 21.—It was announced today by Principal Gordon that by the will of the late Dr. George C. Hoffman of Ottawa, the sum of \$55,000 had been bequeathed to Queen's University for the establishment of two fellowships in surgery and pathology. Also that Chancellor James Douglass of New York had given Queen's another gift of \$50,000 to cover certain departments.

Germany to Move U. S. Relationship To State of War

LONDON, March 21.—"According to private telegrams from Berlin to the Amsterdam bourse, it is expected that a state of war with the United States will be an accomplished fact within 48 hours," says a dispatch to the Exchange Telegraph from Amsterdam.

"American journalists in Berlin," the dispatch adds, "have been warned to this effect by the foreign office."

Stars and Stripes In France Is Hope of U. S. Clergymen

"Ralph Connor" Is Cheered
When He Expresses
Such Wish.

NEW YORK, March 21.—Hope that "the Stars and Stripes would soon be waving over the trenches in France," drew cheers from a hundred clergymen of many denominations here today when they were expressed in an address before them by Major Charles W. Gordon, 43rd Canadian Infantry, better known as "Ralph Connor," the author. Major Gordon is here on a mission for the British war office. He will soon go back to his regiment now in Flanders.

DUTCH WILL FORBID ENTRY TO AMERICAN VESSELS IF ARMED

Reply to the Entente Over
Princess Melita Case
Unsatisfactory.

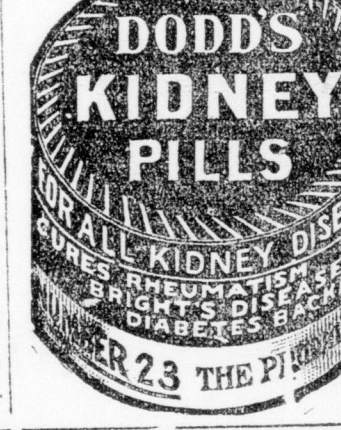
LONDON, March 21.—A dispatch to Reuters' Telegram Company from Amsterdam says:

"It is understood that the Dutch Government has intimated that it is not prepared to allow American armed merchantmen in Dutch harbors. According to the view in well-informed circles, the Dutch reply to representations arising out of the British steamer Princess Melita case will be unsatisfactory from the Entente standpoint."

The steamer Princess Melita arrived at the Hook of Holland during the evening of March 5, but, being armed, was ordered to depart forthwith, according to a dispatch to London, quoting the Dutch naval department as authority. The steamer sailed but returned the next morning, and was permitted to disembark a sick passenger and take on drinking water. A later dispatch from London said the British Government would insist on defensively armed ships being permitted to enter Dutch ports.

AMERICAN ON BOARD NORWEGIAN STEAMER SUNK BY A TORPEDO

Vice-Consul at Rotterdam
Reports the Case to
Washington.

WASHINGTON, March 21.—Torpedoing of the Norwegian steamer Davenag, with one American aboard, by a German submarine on March 14 was reported to the state department today by Vice-Consul Krogh of Rotterdam as follows:

"The Norwegian steamer Davenag of Bergen, Norway, New York to Rotterdam, with one American aboard, the American, Robert Leroy Bragg, Ansel Camp, California, second steward, was stopped by a German submarine on March 14, North Sea, 30 miles from North Hinder Lightship. All officers and crew saved after seventeen hours in lifeboats."

SOLDIERS AND OFFICERS SHOULD BE USED ALIKE

Mayor of Toronto Objects to Special
Privileges.

TORONTO, March 21.—The Ontario minister of land, forests and mines, Hon. C. Howard Ferguson, outlined before the parliamentary commission sitting here today the plan of the Ontario government for placing returned soldiers on the land. He urged that the separation allowance be continued while men were receiving instructions in farming.

Mayor Church protested against the plan whereby officers are allowed to return home on leave from the front, when men are not. They should all be treated alike.

At the afternoon session Col. Marlow stated that a large amount of tubercular sanatoria accommodation was being absorbed by soldiers here, to the disadvantage of returned men. The he accounted for by the fact that mild cases could easily pass medical examinations, and not become apparent till after the rigors of service. Satisfactory arrangements had never been made with the sanatoria to deal with military patients.

Senator Lougheed remarked that the pay demanded by the sanatoria was unreasonable.

Col. Marlow said that in his opinion the entire work should have been done by the Army Medical Corps. The military hospitals commission, he thought, had been created because the Army Medical Corps was overloaded with work. There had been no friction until the commission began to assume control.

AUTHORITIES TRANSLATE "INVISIBLE" WRITING

One of Reasons Wunnenberg and Sander Plead Guilty.

NEW YORK, March 21.—Two reasons were assigned tonight by Government officials for the unexpected pleas of guilty entered by Charles N. Wunnenberg and Albert O. Sander, indicted for engaging in a military enterprise against a power in which the United States is at peace, in carrying on which they sent spies to England to obtain information for the benefit of Germany.

One reason was the knowledge that federal agents raided their offices yesterday and seized papers declared to be highly incriminating. When what appeared to be blank papers were treated with a solution of chemical dyes dissolved in vinegar, the authorities found, they asserted, secret writing in German. Translations were made and would have been used as evidence by the prosecution.

BERLIN REPORTS RETREATS BY BRITISH AND FRENCH

BERLIN, via Sayville, March 21.—The German headquarters report issued today says:

"Western Theatre: Owing to rain and a snowstorm there has been limited fighting activity. Between Arras and Bertincourt and northwest of Ham and north of Soissons our protecting troops forced some mixed movements of our adversaries to retreat with losses."

"On the right bank of the Meuse this morning two attempted advances by the French on the Fosses forest failed."

MEN OF THE NORTH WARNED FOR OVERSEAS

HAMILTON, March 21.—The 22nd Men of the North Battalion, of which Premier Hearn is honorary captain, has been warned for overseas, and the battalion will leave for points east some time tomorrow.

Col. Jones, formerly of the 51st So0 Rifles, is the commanding officer. The men who were recruited around the Soo and Manitoulin Island, includes 100 thoroughbred Indians.
