SARNIA, Oct. 25.—Figures procured by the coal director in the city of Port Huron reveal a shortage of 1,351 tons of anthracite in the homes of 410 Port Huron citizens, When the 520 additional orders are received the actual coal shortage will, it is believed, pass the 3,000-ton mark.
