

Your **ARRIVES IN LONDON**

Many Changes Suggested by Satisfied He Will Find a Good Job by Nightfall.

Educational reforms suggested by Thomas Marshall, member for Lincoln the Provincial Legislature, received amount of approval hero. Many of the changes which he suggests have already been adopted to a certain extent in London.

Mr. Marshall suggests the abolition of all written examinations. This practice is followed here to a large extent pupils being advanced on their class records for the year, rather than by marks obtained at a single examination. Mr. Marshall also suggests that the pressure of compulsory home work he reduced to a minimum, and that more freedom be granted local educational authorities in determining the details of a curriculum. Home work in the London schools is reduced to the lowest possible point, Trustee Thomas Coleridge stated today.

Public School Inspector C. B. Edwards approves the suggestion of a larger provincial grant, with particular reference to teachers' salaries. Mr. Edwards pointed out some time ago that assistance of this kind is given by the English Government.
