RUSSIANS CONE PARLEY BREAK MISUNDERSTANDING

Wireless Dispatch From Soviets Suggests Negotiations For Armistice and Peace in Minsk On Wednesday — Russians Expect To Enter Warsaw August 9.

WARSAW, Aug. 3.—(Associated Press).—The breaking off of the negotiations between the Poles and the Bolsheviks, out of which it had been hoped would come the armistice and the early cessation of hostilities, was due to a misunderstanding, according to the contention of the Russian Soviet authorities in a wireless dispatch received here today.

The latest communication from the Soviet suggests that negotiations, both for an armistice and for peace, be held in Minsk Wednesday.

It asks that the Poles send a delegation to Minsk to negotiate for peace. The Poles contend that it will be a physical impossibility for them to comply with this proposal. While the Polish delegates are retracing their steps, the Bolsheviks are retracing theirs.

Inside the great battle area the Poles are hurriedly preparing defences, placing trenches and barbed wire entanglements in front of Warsaw.

The move for an armed volunteer force had its inception with the Tourangeau of Malden road, whose home was attacked by five automobile loads of thugs last week.

Every farmer is arming his household and a system has been devised where, in cases of attack, neighbors could be summoned to the aid of the victim.

Referring to the Detroiters who have been crossing in cars on the ferries and along the Detroit river, the Tourangeau declared today: "These men are dangerous, but let me tell you the year in which they have been moved to a place of safety and that if any of them visit our place again they will be killed."
