Ed. Weston, the Ped., Still Hale and Hearty At Seventy-Eight

New York, Dec. 27.—Still hale and hearty, and not at all doubtful but that he is stronger in spirit than many who are younger in years, Edward Payson Weston, the noted pedestrian, celebrated his seventy-eighth birthday last week. Weston was born in Portland, Maine, Dec. 18, 1839, and his transcontinental pedestrian feats, performed when he was past the three-score-and-ten mark, furnish added proof of the virtues of walking in preserving health and vigor. Thirty and forty years ago pedestrianism was among the most popular of sports, and the great walking matches in American and English cities aroused wide enthusiasm. Most of the famous professional pedestrians of the past were Englishmen, and not a few of them are still living—and one of the most famous of the old school, still claims to be the champion heel-and-toe walker in the world. He is John W. White, O'Leary, since he commenced his professional career in 1867, has walked over 1,000 miles in England, France, Ireland, Austria, Canada and the United States.

WERE ON WRONG TRACK SWITCHED RIGHT NOW

New York, Dec. 27.—Mr. Dudley A. Sargent, director of physical education at Harvard, today said that he and Edward Payson Weston had been on the wrong track in athletics and physical education for the last 25 years, but that now, as a result of the war, they were coming around and were beginning to see that athletic should be for the many and not for the few specialized stars.

"Get everybody into the game, is the slogan that the colleges should have now," said Dr. Sargent.

Dr. Sargent, director of athletics at Ohio State University, and once a famous football player at the University of Wisconsin, read a report on a detailed study of intra-mural athletics at the colleges and universities. He showed that there had been a general increase in interest in intra-mural sports throughout the country and thought the cause was the war.
