THE RETERAT OF "OLD MAIDS."—There are now about 900 British families spending their private incomes within St. Heiler's, Jersey: 600 families of British tradespeople and shopkeepers, 2000 labouring poor and mechanics, and 600 aged, adirm, and sick. One very remarkable circumstance connected with the British population of St. Helier's, is the very small proportion in the class of males amongst the adults. There are, out of 2400 souls, only 400 men, while there are 13000 unmarried females, 200 married females and 400 widows; this is exclusive of children under 15 years of age,—or about 20 females to 4 males. Thus 30 per cent, of the adult British residents are of the upper class adult females, otherwise "old maids."—Jersey Times.
