UTILITIES BOARD'S ANNUAL REPORT

Predericton, N. B., March 7—The report of the board of commissioners of public utilities was tabled in the legislature today and covers the activities of the board for the year ended April 30,

The financial statement of the commission shows receipts for the period mentioned of \$12,121.07, consisting of fees received from the various utilities, especially heavy payments by the New Brunswick Telephone Company as its share for the services of experts in fixing the rates of the company. The expenditures, which consisted mainly of fees to experts, commissioners' salaries, office expenses, etc., amounted to \$11,682.53, leaving a balance of \$438.54.




