

## Magellan Honored By Slayers' Descendants

MONUMENT BY THE SEA IN MACTAN, PHILIPPINES, MARKS WHERE ADVENTUROUS CIRCUMNAVIGATOR WAS KILLED 400 YEARS AGO

In Santiago, the capital of the Republic of Chile, there was celebrated a few days ago the four hundredth anniversary of the voyage to South America of that adventurous navigator Ferdinand Magellan. Representatives from many countries met to honor this pioneer of the unknown seas, whose name will ever live in South America, not only by reason of his heroic defiance of the perils of the sea, but because his name has been given to the straits that connect the two great oceans that he crossed.

Nearly every school child is more or less familiar with the name and the fact that Magellan was a great sailor, and that he, or rather the survivors of the little party of daring and courageous men that he captained, was the first to complete the circumnavigation of the globe. It is not so generally known, however, that he met his death at the hands of savages whose descendants are now living quietly and prosperously under the Stars and Stripes.

The little island of Mactan, one of the Philippine group, lies now in a blistering sun opposite the large and mountainous island of Cebu and almost directly opposite the city of Cebu. Cebu is one of the richest and largest islands of the archipelago and the city of Cebu is today one of the most important ports in the islands. Cebu is also rated as the second hottest city in the world—Aden alone having a higher average temperature. It was on Mactan, four hundred years ago, that Magellan met his death.

Had Five Small Vessels.

Magellan was in command of five small vessels—the largest of one hundred and thirty tons and the smallest of but eighty—sailing from Soborosa, Portugal in September, 1519. On December 13 he entered the harbor which has since become the great port of Rio de Janeiro. Here he spent much time in preparations and repairs for continuing his journey.

The following November he entered the straits which now bear his name, but which he called the "Canal de Todos los Santos" (All Saints' Channel). The passage through this dangerous channel was completed in three weeks, and Magellan's small fleet entered the great Pacific and headed northwest.

He reached the Philippine Islands in March and named them San Lazaro, the name being subsequently changed to Philippine. After cruising for some days among these picturesque islands, he put into the harbor of Cebu for rest and to repair his ships, which had just completed the first trip across the greatest of all oceans and were badly in need of overhauling.

For some time the natives of the island treated this little band of adventurers even with marked kindness, but it was not long before the old law "familiarity breeds contempt" began to manifest itself in the attitude of the natives toward the strange newcomers and eventually most of the 234 that had started out upon the expedition had fallen victims to the sea, or disease, or had been murdered by the savage natives of Cebu and Mactan.

Monument on the Shore.

The place on the island of Mactan where Magellan last saw the light of day is marked by a rude stone monument. It stands near the shore and the lapping of the waves makes a fitting dirge for so great a sailor. Many ships, huge transports a hundred times as large as the largest vessel piloted by Magellan, pass the spot, and there is always some member of the crew standing by to repeat to you the story of the murder. It seems a matter of pride among the natives today that so great a man, so daring a sailor and the renowned Magellan, should have fallen a victim to the poisoned arrows of the naked savages of Mactan four centuries ago. The fate which befell Magellan was also that of

Importance with the fall of the Kaiser and said that the day would be celebrated one hundred years hence as the centennial of one of the greatest events in the history of the country, equally as important as Emancipation Day and Independence Day.

## KRAMER SUMS UP FIRST "DRY" YEAR

Believes Liquor Drinking is Tapering Off

U. S. Commissioner Thinks Sentiment Favorable to Law Enforcement is Increasing

Predicts End of "Appetite."

Washington, Jan. 18.—As the first year of national prohibition ended, Prohibition Commissioner Kramer declared the American people were rapidly recovering from their "hang-over." He believed they have begun to taper off their liquor drinking. Although liquor, some of it good, but much of it bad, still is obtainable in large quantities, the head of the prohibition enforcement corps believes the first year's work has brought a large measure of success.

In the future, the Commissioner said, enforcement of the law should become easier, while those who used to put a foot on the brass rail should gradually become reconciled to the saloonless era.

"In our first year," said Mr. Kramer, "we have seen the private stocks absorbed like lakes in the desert. We have raided and prosecuted. We believe we have made life unpleasant for the bootlegger and other traffickers in whiskey. It has been a difficult and sometimes dangerous job, yet those of us who have been on the job itself can see changes for the better."

But there remains much to do, the commissioner declared. He told of simply the satisfaction of the "hang-over" appetite. He believes it is proof that social drinkings, the have-nots one-on-one kind of consumption, has definitely passed forever into oblivion.

"Of course," the Commissioner continued, "there is still the social drinking in the homes wherever there is a private supply. But the nightly party drinking is gone. I have heard men say they would take a drink now when they were thirsty, but they would not take a drop while the saloons were all about them. The cause for that is found in the spirit of adventure, born in most Americans, and it will continue to cause some trouble rather directly, for a while, but it will gradually disappear."

Disappearance of the "appetite" of the steady drinker also is predicted by Mr. Kramer, who forces in that connection practically the end of the bootlegger.

He asserted that while there always would be some demand for "hard liquor," prohibition enforcement in a few years would have resolved itself into a simple problem of vigilance, a guarding against the production of moonshine and the patrolling of the border and coasts against smuggling.

Liquor smuggling, like the production of moonshine whisky, has developed into a business of high profits since the advent of prohibition. In fact, revenue officers assert that the value of liquor thus brought in exceeded the estimated worth of all other smuggled commodities.

Mr. Kramer, said the enforcement agents' worst problem with respect to liquor "running" was in the Great Lakes and along the St. Lawrence River section of the Canadian border. It has been difficult to curb and the end is not yet. The profits are increasing as the local supplies decrease and this condition, the Commissioner believes, means that greater effort at enforcement must be concentrated along the borders of the country.

Port cities, especially along the Atlantic Coast, have given the bureau trouble, for foreign mariners are willing to help Americans obtain quantities of any kind of beverages no longer sold here. But a weeding out of the enforcement staff, the elimination of men who have not resisted the smuggling of liquor from foreign ships, is expected by officials to correct that condition eventually.

As for the moonshiner, Mr. Kramer stated that "we always will have some of him with us." Operating in the mountain fastness, his still will spring up again and again, but the head of the dry forces is optimistic. He declared the sentence had been read for the moon-
